Why are you participating in Odyssey 2000®?

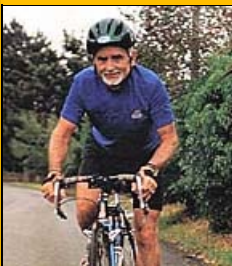
My sister signed up and asked if I would like to go. She has since dropped out.
